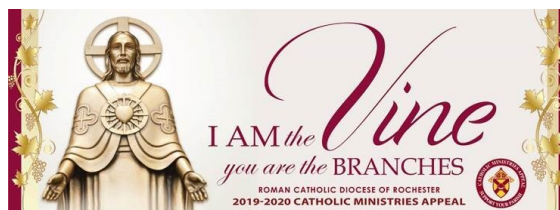

Annual March For Life

Thursday, January 23rd - Saturday, January 25th many of our teens, along with myself and some other courageous adults, will board a bus for our annual trip to Washington, D.C. for the March For Life. This week please pray that it will be a powerful and sobering few days in which we will learn about what it means to Respect Life from conception to natural death. Together we will take time to pray throughout the trip and celebrate Mass at our National Basilica and again with thousands of other teens at the Catholic Youth Rally for Life.

We will learn about the grave injustice and the tragic disrespect for life that occurred with slavery, as we visit the African American Museum. We will also reflect on the dreams and hopes that our public and government leaders have had throughout the history of our country as we visit various Monuments. We will try to feel the presence of God through the lives and deaths of those who we remember as we walk in silence past the Vietnam Memorial, the Korean War Memorial, and read the words of President Lincoln who sought freedom for every person who lives in the United States of America. These monuments will give us much to think about; when is war justified or not and that risking our own lives and the potential to take another's life in war is very serious and does change a country forever.

A film from the Silent No More Campaign will be shown in which we will listen to the real and pain filled stories, from both women and men, who have regretted their abortions. We will take time to talk honestly with our youth about the life choices that some of them are faced with and strongly encourage them to always chose life! We also hope to engage them in a discussion of how to respect the beauty of God's gift of sexuality.

Following the Youth Mass, we begin the March for Life to the United States Supreme Court Building. While we wait, we will see various other groups and people who also came to protest; the young and not so young, moms with babies in strollers, families, high school and college groups, members of the Silent No More Campaign, Knights of Columbus, women and men of various Religious Communities, and many other organizations! Every year our young people are amazed that hundreds of thousands of people gather to advocate for the sacredness of all life and protest the legalization of abortion!

Once we arrive at the Supreme Court Building we will listen, in person, to many of the stories that women and men will share about their abortions and their healing through God and by forgiving themselves. There are few words that can describe all the thoughts and feelings that each of us will experience on this day.

Ninety percent of the evaluations that we received from our young people in the past contained comments about the March for Life and the testimonies that they hear. The pain of abortion for the baby, its mother and father, and others becomes real. Let me share with you some of the comments that are teens have voiced...

"I learned that abortion never makes people lives any easier. But, in fact having an abortion haunted them for the rest of their lives."

"Abortion changes your life forever!"

"I realized that I have been holding back sadness due to my own mother's abortions. She had one abortion before I was born and another one after I was born."

"The most important thing that I learned was to appreciate my own life."

"Every life is so precious. Every life is from God"

"A baby is a MIRACLE not a mistake."

"I'm happy to be alive and I need to love more and be grateful for my life."

Please pray for a safe and good trip to Washington for the March for Life for all of us. Pray that this experience will have an impact on our youth in a deep way so that may always make good choices that are in support of LIFE for themselves and for others! Pray that our country and all of its citizens will come to understand that LIFE is a gift from God to be respected, loved and protected - ALWAYS!
